

Up North Camping Ride IV By: Bob Komjathy



I look forward to this ride every year. Where else can you wear all your protective gear in comfort not sweltering to the point of dehydration, mountains, curves, landscapes to awe at, spending time with great friends with a common interest in riding motorcycles?

This year's ride was designed to be adjustable based on the time you had to get away from home or work... a 4 day weekend, 6 day trip, or a 7 day excursion to take in Keith Danielson's *That's Unique Grand Tour* U.P. check points. There were some long days of 300-mile rides broken up into getting there with extra curves through the rides to wake people up and shake off the dust.

We had 19 people on the ride out of 21 that signed up. 6 did the short version and 11 did the 6 day ride and 3 braved another 560 miles on top of the last day to catch 6 checkpoints. My total was 2,630 miles and each mile was met with grins of joy.

Day 1- We all got to Tobermory in plenty of time to catch a good meal and wait for the ferry. One new member Mario Bahri who signed up at the

last minute couldn't get on our 5:30 departure but was able to get on the 1:30 p.m. departure. Like a trooper, got out the hotel door in Marysville at 6 a.m. and made it to Tobermory in time to meet us at the Manitoulin Eco Park Campground. A relaxing 1 1/2-hour ferry ride to South Baymouth, Manitoulin.



Day 2 -The campground is also a dark sky preserve so I was able to catch a little Northern Lights activity as well as the Milky Way. The next day was Trans-Canada 17 and Ontario 129. I cautioned everyone to completely fill up with gas at the designated gas stop in the town of Iron Bridge, Ontario. Fortunately, everyone complied. The gas stop mid-way through the ride had a sign that read "Gas Soon" so other than go out of the way for gas at Chapleau, what they had in their tanks is what they were going to need to complete the journey. Kinniwabi Pines for dinner was outstanding.

Day 3-Hump day... getting around the north shore of Lake Superior. Fog and some rain made for some spectacular vistas. Lunch was at Serendipity Cafe in Rossport, Ontario. As good as I remembered... everyone loved what they chose. Mine was the Superior Lake Trout...enough fish to feed two.... But I managed.... then no dinner... still too full. The last 30 miles of the route before U.S. Customs was a couple of back roads. Ontario 588 and Ontario 593 were absolutely a joy to ride. 35 miles of Tunnel of Trees type roads with no center line and nor side lines. Short, twisty, and elevation changes to boot. I have a new route I will insist on including in future rides!



Day 4- A non- motorcycle day other than a short ride to the docks to take us to Isle Royale. One incident with another camper who had some mental issues that security and U.S. Customs (since these are Indian lands) and deputy sheriff officers help to escort the individual off the property. David Marquette has been promoted from Pie Trailer Dave to Asshole Security Dave. Good Job!!! I have to mention that the bathrooms/showers had a code for entry.... the code was easy to remember "2-4-6-8, we are ready to urinate".

Isle Royale was just gorgeous! It's worth the time to visit the island. In our back yard and first time for me in my 70 years here in Michigan.

Day 5- Leaving Minnesota heading back to Michigan. Down Mn-61 to Duluth, I saw a black bear cross the road ahead of me near Cascade Falls. On the route was a possible visit to the Aerostich motorcycle clothing factory in Duluth. Lunch in Ashland, Wisconsin and some more back roads to Iron Mountain that were very curvy as an alternative to US-2. Hiawatha statue checkpoint in Ironwood was captured before heading onto this night's stop point. The end of the day ended up at the River's Bend Campground just down the street from the Skijump checkpoint.

Day 6- Option to head home after a brisk ride down some good roads, head home directly, or

continue to capture the final 4 U.P. checkpoints.... The Naughty Cow, Keweenaw snow gauge, Lakenenland Art Park, and the Tower of History in Sault St. Marie. (560 additional miles over the return from the Mackinac Bridge). Got-em done! Dave Burr, Mike Gouin, and yours truly got the U.P. in the bag!

Day 7- <u>Head Home.</u> Went with Dave Burr to do Paul and Babe since it could be worked into our path. I had done it already, but it made it easier to get it done for him rather than go back and pay for real estate twice. My rear tire found a nail on I-75 near Flint. Exited the freeway and wouldn't you know it across from the exit... a tire store. (just lucky) I repaired the tire in 20 minutes filled with air and checked with soap solution for leaks ...arrived home near 5 p.m.

I think everyone who went will have fond memories of this trip for quite some time. Thank you all that came along. It was a pleasure to arrange this ride.



### Lucky Thumb M/C Racing By: Jeff Anderson

This June 9 & 10 event was Classic D14 AMA Flat Track racing at its finest. Multiple classes of both late model (modified 4 stroke motocross bikes both 250 & 450cc), vintage class (Triumphs, Yamahas and Hondas) and youth class on small KTM's and Hondas.



The track is a 1/4 mile oval and the TT expands this with a couple of jumps. Spectators have complete access to the pits and can walk right up and talk to the mechanics and riders. The really fast riders were hitting the rev limiter as they crossed the start finish line. In several spots you can get really close to the track.



Pictures show a Yamaha 650 (mid 70's), Honda FT500 Ascot, and what was once an early 80's Yamaha YZ motocross bike with a Harbor Freight "predator engine" and a snowmobile trans configuration (the most unusual bike that night!).



The track is located about 25 miles north of Imlay City and has upcoming races if you're interested in attending.



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
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
