BBR7 Wrap-up

The 2023 edition of the Barn Burn Raid was held from August 13th to the 20th. It was intended to be flexible to accommodate whatever people's schedules would allow, with some people arriving as early as Saturday the 12th and staying to the 20th, and others arriving as late as Friday the 18th, and some people leaving early. There were a total of 28 riders who participated in this year's BBR, and none were disappointed with the options presented for riding.

For those riding down on Saturday and Sunday, the weather was mixed with periods of sun and rain. For me, arriving on Saturday, it would rain for a little while, then the sun would come out. About the time I was getting dried out, I'd encounter another shower, and I'd once again feel the water entering my old worn-out riding suit. Once in Marietta, it was beautiful riding weather all day Sunday for those got in on Saturday, with mild temperatures, and clear skies. The weather on Monday was not quite so good (mild understatement here), as it

rained pretty much all day, and the motorcycles stayed parked all day. Not all was lost, however, as we did have some good Euchre games in the lobby of the hotel. Once past the rain on Monday, however, the rest of the week proved to be some of the best weather ever for the Barn Burn Raid with little to no rain, and temperatures only reaching into the mid-80s most days.



As for routes, there were 13 routes to choose from with 9 having the option to run it clockwise or counterclockwise. These included a couple of new routes to the Hocking Hills and Hawk's Nest State Park. The Hocking Hills ride featured a couple of options for lunch in Nelsonville, and Hawk's Nest State Park has a beautiful lodge that serves up a great lunch, taken while overlooking the New River Gorge. The usual options included the Beallsville (lunch at the Beallsville Diner), Big Muskie ride (gotta stop to see the Big Muskie Bucket), the Wee Circle, Circle, and Great Circle rides, the Hillbilly ride (lunch at Hillbilly Hot Dogs), New River Gorge ride, and the WV Figure Eight ride. The rides offered distances ranging from 180 miles to 329 miles, taking riders in all directions from Marietta. In addition to all of those, there were two rides of 90 and 100 miles for those who had trailered down and wanted to get in one last ride on Sunday before loading the bikes on/in the trailer and heading home. All of the rides offered twisties to satisfy those looking to wear their tires from edge to edge, and lunch stops that give mom's home cooking a run for the money, all of which make you want to go back and do it all over again. The most difficult decision each day had to be just picking which great ride to do for the day and which direction to do it in.



At the end of each day, the second most difficult decision of the day presented itself in deciding where to go for dinner. With the choices available, it was possible to eat dinner in a different establishment every night that one was there, with virtually every type of cuisine you could imagine available.

All in all, there is little doubt that this year's BBR was one of the best ever, and that everyone who attended hated for the week to come to a close and head home.

Next year, we'll return to Marietta in August for BBR8. Put it on your calendar, schedule your vacation, tell the kids or relatives that you have a mandatory meeting elsewhere and to come on another date, and make sure you don't miss it again.

Cherohala Skyway closure


Cherohala Skyway, the 43-mile National Scenic Byway and National Forest Scenic Byway that connects Tellico, Plains, Tennessee and Robbinsville, has been closed.

The Graham County Emergency Planning Committee met Wednesday and voted to close the road as part of a state of emergency declaration due to complete road failure from flooding. A barricade has been put in place with no checkpoint.

No timeline has been given as to when the road might reopen.

We expect it will be repaired in time for next year's MSTR MR2 event in May.

If you are not familiar with Shanty Creek Resort there are nearby coffee and dining venues within an easy walk from the Legend Cottage Inn: The Pelican's Nest, Sarducci's Creekside, The Lakeview Restaurant and The Shanty Bar and Grill.

From the Lakeview Hotel, which very close to the Legend Cottage Inn, we can take the available shuttle to get us into Bellaire proper (although not all at once). Once in town you can enjoy the Corner Bistro, Mammoth Distillery, Be Well Meadery, The Bellaire Bar, Toonies, M88 Coffee, Short's Brewery and the Lunch Box.

There will be mandatory rider's meetings on Thursday and Friday night held in the parking lot of the Legend Cottage Inn to discuss point riders, riding groups and GPS routes. GPS Routes will be available around the beginning to September to everyone who has signed up.

Fall Color Ride '23 September 28-October 1, 2022



This year our Fall Color Ride returns at the end of September to the beginning of October. This is somewhat of a traveling event, as we will begin in Marietta, OH on Thursday evening, Sep 28 with dinner and a rider's meeting. On Friday we'll split up into groups, and head south into West Virginia following some of our usual assortment of twisty bits of tarmac, and maybe some slightly different ones too, arriving in Lewisburg on Friday afternoon.

Once there, you can remove some of the baggage from your motorcycle, because Saturday we'll enjoy some of the twisty treats that West Virginia and Virginia have to offer and return to the same place at the end of the day. On Sunday, Oct 1, we'll ride a more direct route, though still with a good amount of interesting roads for the return to Marietta and back home. Most people will load the bikes back into the trailers after arrival in Marietta on Sunday and arrive back home on Sunday evening.

We'll be there along with the MSTA FCR. If you want to get the MSTA routes, you can register by emailing Chris Shoop at shoope@gmail.com or by going to planetreg.com to register online. There is no cost to register with the MSTA, though they will take donations. All fees in excess of the minimal event costs will go to Ride for Kids. You don't need to be an MSTA member.

Our Marietta accommodations will be at the Microtel Inn & Suites. They have a large parking area behind the hotel where we can leave trailers and tow vehicles. There is no block of rooms, so if you want to go, just call the Microtel directly at

(740) 373-7373 to reserve your room. Use your AAA, AARP or other discount for their best rate. In Lewisburg, call the Quality Inn & Suites directly at (304) 645-7722. When you register with Keith he'll send you information for the group rate at the Quality Inn.

Riding on the Edge September 24 - 29, 2023



The Fall Color Ride (FCR) in Lewisburg is the last ride of the year. Wouldn't it be great to be able to stretch out that last ride of the year and discover some new roads in the process? That was the idea behind **Riding on the Edge** (**ROTE**), ride some new roads on the weekdays before FCR. Of course, the extra riding would have to be flexible to let people do as many or as few days as they wanted. And it would have to be in easy reach of Lewisburg. Where to start?

Somewhere south and east of the intersection of Tennessee, North Carolina, and Virginia is West Jefferson, NC. It sits at 3000 feet elevation on the Appalachian Plateau and is surrounded by the Blue Ridge mountains. It lies in beautiful country and is surrounded by some very nice

roads. West Jefferson sits about halfway between Lewisburg and Waynesville and 170 miles to Lewisburg. It is also 560 miles by slab and a little over 600 miles by backroads from Livonia and about 280 miles from Marietta.

That leaves some interesting possibilities. There is a 2-day, backroads route down from Toledo. The ambitious can ride down Saturday and Sunday, Sept. 23 and 24, ride ROTE routes Monday through Thursday, and follow the 1-day route from West Jefferson to Lewisburg on Friday, Sept 29.

Some will want to do that except head up to Marietta on Thursday. Then make the traditional ride from Marietta to Lewisburg on Friday.

Still others will come down later or trailer down. Do what works for you.

For those of you who don't want to ride in Virginia, no worries. Only one of the routes spends any time riding in the Forbidden Zone. The majority of the routes and miles are in N. Carolina with a dash of Tennessee on the western routes.

Now, down to the details. The dates you have (top of the page). The location you have. To avoid non-members taking advantage of our room block, I am asking that you sign up at one of the meetings or email me at the address below to be on the sign-up sheet. Please remind me and I will send you the hotel details and will send you a link and instructions for making a reservation. Hope to see you down there.









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
