

Of course every route includes a great lunch stop such as the *Beallsville Diner*, **Boondocks BBQ**, *Hillbilly Hotdogs*, *Maxwell's Pizza*, and *Pies & Pints*. BBR is headquartered in Marietta, Ohio making it a comfortable one-day ride from many Michigan locations. Michigan Renegade Mountain Ride (MR2 9) Wrap-Up By Ian Orr
