

MoArk Adventure 17

This ride is a "curve-chaser's" delight. There are three days of riding, with 1,000 tire-shredding miles in the Ozark's to start out your riding season. Check your tires for tread prior to this ride, the roads here will chew them up. If in doubt, mount new tires.

MoArk 17 begins in Farmington, Missouri. We'll meet there for dinner on Wednesday, April 16th. There will be a mandatory rider's meeting around 8:00 or 8:30pm. On Thursday morning you can choose from one of six routes from Farmington to Mountain Home, Arkansas, or you can combine different routes. We'll then be staying Thursday, April 17th and Friday, April 18th in Mountain Home. On Friday, you have a choice of five loop routes (or make up your own), but no matter which you'll be riding on some of the best roads in Arkansas. On Saturday, April 19th you again have a choice of six routes to return to Farmington, Missouri from Mountain Home, arriving mid-afternoon and then prepare for the ride or trailer trip back to Michigan.

Extended MoArk

If you have the time, and the tires, you can add three days to the front end of MoArk 17 and ride more of the incredible roads in Missouri and Arkansas. The Extended MoArk ride begins in Farmington, Missouri on Sunday, April 13th. On Monday, we'll ride to and stay Eureka Springs. On Tuesday, we'll ride to Mount Magazine and stay there for two days. On Thursday we'll ride to Mountain Home, Arkansas and join the MoArk 17 riders and ride with them on Friday and return to Farmington on Saturday.

2025 Michigan Grand Tour

SHHHHH!!!

Get ready for the MSTR 2025 Michigan grand tour. This year's theme is historic libraries. Specifically, Carnegie Libraries.

You've probably heard of Andrew Carnegie, the steel baron from the late 18th century, after whom Carnegie Hall in New York City is named, along with a couple of other Carnegie Halls in other cities back in the day. But did you know that he provided grants for almost 1700 libraries that were built around the country, and another 800 built around the world? Yes, with the vast wealth that he accumulated from his business ventures, he created a foundation for philanthropy. From 1883 to 1929, his foundation gave grants to communities around the world to build libraries so that average people could become educated and informed, and better their lot in life.

From February 1902 to April 1918, grants totaling \$1,655,950 were awarded to 53 communities in Michigan to build 61 libraries, with some communities receiving multiple libraries. Today, many of those 61 libraries still remain. Some continue to operate as libraries, while others have been converted to museums, offices, and other uses. Sadly, some have been demolished to make way for newer developments.

For this year's grand tour, you will visit 14 libraries or former libraries, with our usual eight in the lower peninsula and 6 in the upper peninsula, so you can get out and see as much of our great state as you care to see. To document your visit, all you need to do is take a picture of your motorcycle with the grand tour sign and the checkpoint behind it. If riding two-up, you can take one picture as above

with your passenger in it. At the MOTY banquet we'll have the usual awards for Grand Tourers, Baby Grand Tourers, and Trolls (for those who have to stay below the bridge). You can also earn up to 42 extra credits for special recognition as a Grand Tourer PRO. Extra credits can include other historic Michigan libraries, attractions, scenic spots, historical spots, unique restaurants (McDonald's doesn't count), or whatever else you find that is uniquely Michigan. As in the past, all you will need to do is sign up at a meeting, or request the information directly by emailing me at keithmdanielson@gmail.com to receive the detailed information for the grand tour.

The grand tour runs from March 29 to near the end of the year. It's done at your convenience, in any order, by yourself or with friends, and as quickly or slowly as you like. There are no prescribed routes, just 14 checkpoints. It's basically an excuse with a destination to go for a ride on your motorcycle.


